## PROGRAM AGENDA

The Government of the Democratic Republic of Timor-Leste is proud to host the “Global Conference on the 2030 Agenda: A Roadmap for SDGs in Fragile and Conflict-Affected States” on 22-23 May 2017 in Dili, Timor-Leste. The conference is organized in partnership with the members of the informal High Level Support Group for SDGs and the g7+ Secretariat. It brings together High Level policy makers from Governments, Development Partners and Civil Society Organizations and will provide a platform to discuss challenges and to share lessons and best practices on the implementation of the 2030 Agenda in fragile and conflict-affected states. Over two days, the first day (22nd May 2017) will consist of a high level meeting for policy makers where the broad issues of 2030 Agenda in fragile and conflict-affected states will be deliberated. At the end of Day 1, a conference declaration will be approved outlining key resolutions and the participant’s commitments. Day 2 will consist of a technical meeting on the best approach towards the strengthening of a mechanism of cooperation between fragile and conflict-affected states towards SDGs implementation; drawing on the global experience of fragile states and south-south cooperation.
